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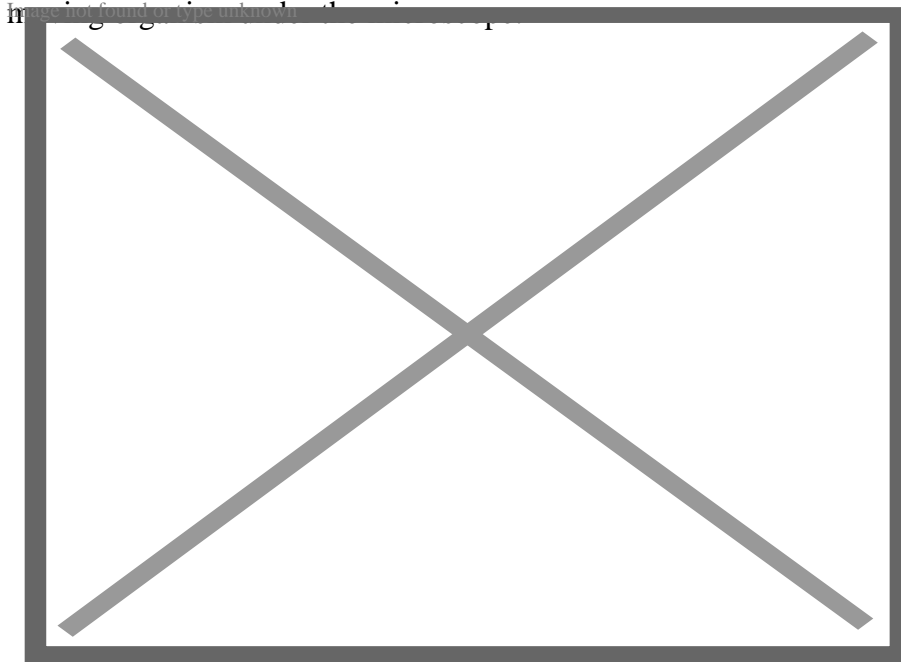
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Hanako Murakami

Artist Profile as part of Processing Space–Times

Hanako Murakami's (Japan) works are based on her in-depth research of historical media, such as alternative photographic techniques and letterpress printing. By creating speculative experiments with these media, she produces situations in which truth and fiction are intertwined. 'Exposure' was made using a powerful electron microscope in a laboratory for artistic conservation research. It shows the reaction of the photosensitive material used in daguerreotypes when it contacts light. The mechanical gaze burns the object, while it resembles a
